ORDER APPROVING AMENDMENTS  
TO BY-LAWS, WYOMING STATE BAR

Pursuant to § 5-2-118, W.S.1977, and Rule 12, Rules Providing for the Organization and Government of the Bar of Attorneys at Law of the State of Wyoming, after consideration in conference and otherwise between the Officers and Bar Commissioners of the Wyoming State Bar and this Court, it is

ORDERED that effective this date, the By-Laws of the Wyoming State Bar, as amended, be and are approved to read:

ARTICLE I

Section 1.

There shall be the following standing committees of the Wyoming State Bar:

1. Legislative and law reform;
2. Necrology;
3. Legal education and admission to the bar;
4. Committee to co-operate with American Law Institute;
5. Advisory Committee to co-operate with American Bar Association;
6. Bench-bar relations.

The president of said state bar with the advice and consent of the commissioners, shall appoint the members of said committees for three (3) years. Provided, however, that no person appointed after September 1, 1981 shall be permitted to serve on any of said committees for two (2) consecutive terms.

Section 2.

Such other standing committees and special committees shall be established annually as the board of commissioners shall from time to time determine to be necessary to properly carry on the functions of the state bar or to assist special committees of the American Bar Association. Appointments to such committees shall be made by the president of the bar.

Section 3.

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Legislative and Law Reform to consider and recommend to the state bar action concern-

ing proposed legislation and constitutional amendments affecting the bar of the state and the practice of law in the state and to convey such recommendations as are approved by the Wyoming State Bar to the legislature.

Section 4.

It shall be the duty of the commissioner in each judicial district to, when he is advised of the sickness or death of a member of the bar in his district, send flowers to the sick and condolences to the families of deceased members either honorary, active or retired, and appoint proper district committees on resolutions or other appropriate action; also to collect and provide all necessary information for the necrology committee of the state bar and notify the executive-director of the state bar.

Section 5.

All committees appointed shall have their functions explained to them at the time of appointment.

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ARTICLE II

Section 1.

It shall be the duty of the president with the advice and consent of the commissioners to select the time, place and program for the annual meeting of the state bar in accord with the Rules of the supreme court providing for the organization of the state bar.

Section 2.

The order of business of each annual meeting of the state bar shall be substantially as follows:


1. Reading of minutes of last preceding annual meeting and special meetings, if any, unless dispensed with on motion;
2. Address of the president;
3. Reports of officers and committees;
4. A report of the Chief Justice of the Wyoming Supreme Court on the state of the judiciary;
5. Miscellaneous business;
6. Election of officers.

ARTICLE III

These by-laws have been approved by the supreme court and may, from time to time, be amended by the board of commissioners by and with the advice and consent of the court.
