ORDER ADOPTING EMERGENCY TEMPORARY PROVISION TO ARTICLE I,
SECTION 3(d), BYLAWS OF THE WYOMING STATE BAR

THIS MATTER having come before the Court upon notification from the President, Wyoming State Bar, that there is a need for an emergency temporary addition to Article I, Section 3(d) regarding classes of membership, specifically, inactive status, and the Court finding good cause, it is

ORDERED that application of the requirement that an inactive member must be engaged in the active practice of law in this or another state for five (5) of the preceding seven (7) years in order to return to active status without examination may be waived for inactive members who can demonstrate that the member received advice from the Wyoming State Bar staff that they could return to active status without examination if the member returned within seven (7) years of electing inactive status. Application to return to active status under this temporary change must be received by the Bar Office no later than October 1, 2008. There shall be no appeal of a denial under this provision. It is further


ORDERED that this temporary provision be, and hereby is, adopted by the Court to be effective immediately; and it is further

ORDERED that this provision shall automatically terminate and be of no force or effect on November 1, 2008; and it is further

ORDERED that due to the temporary nature of the provision, it shall not be published in the advance sheets of the Pacific Reporter, the Wyoming Reporter, or the Wyoming Court Rules volume, but shall be posted on the Wyoming Supreme Court website, the Law Library website, and the Wyoming State Bar website.
