ORDER AMENDING AND RE-ADOPTING THE WYOMING RULES OF
CIVIL PROCEDURE FOR COUNTY COURTS

The court deeming it necessary and proper to amend and re-adopt the Wyoming Rules of Civil Procedure for County Courts, effective immediately, for the reason that the recently revised Wyoming Rules of Civil Procedure became effective on March 24, 1992, and now govern the procedures to be followed in civil cases in county courts; it is therefore

ORDERED that Rule 1.06, Wyoming Rules of Civil Procedure for County Courts, shall be, and it is hereby, amended as follows:

Rule 1.06. Provisions of W.R.C.P. not applicable in county courts.

The following rules of the revised Wyoming Rules of Civil Procedure shall not apply in county courts, unless and until county courts have statutory subject matter jurisdiction of cases in which such relief is requested:

- Rule 23, 23.1 and 23.2--CLASS ACTIONS
- Rule 38(b)(2)--JURY FEES
- Rule 40(b)--ADR/MEDIATION
- Rule 52(c)--RESERVED QUESTIONS TO SUPREME COURT
- Rule 62(a), (c) and (e)--STAY ON INJUNCTION APPEALS
- Rule 65--INJUNCTIONS
- Rule 66--RECEIVERS
- Rule 70--SPECIFIC PERFORMANCE; VESTING TITLE
- Rule 71.1--CONDEMNATION OF PROPERTY
- Rule 83--RULES OF DISTRICT COURTS
- Rule 84--FORMS
- Rule 85--TITLE
- Rule 86(a)--EFFECTIVE DATE


It is further

ORDERED that the current Wyoming Rules of Civil Procedure for County Courts, including Rule 1.06, as amended herein, shall be, and they are hereby, re-adopted by the court to govern the procedures to be followed in civil cases in the county courts; it is further
