**ORDER AMENDING SECTIONS IV, XI, AND XIII OF THE
REGULATIONS OF THE WYOMING STATE
BOARD OF CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION**

The Wyoming State Board of Continuing Legal Education and the Board of Commissioners of the Wyoming State Bar having recommended to the court the amendment of Sections IV, XI, and XIII of the Regulations of the Wyoming State Board of Continuing Legal Education, attached hereto; and the court having examined the proposed amendments and deeming the adoption thereof to be advisable; it is therefore

ORDERED that Sections IV, XI, and XIII of the Regulations of the Wyoming State Board of Continuing Legal Education, as amended and attached hereto, shall be, and they are hereby, adopted; and it is further

ORDERED that the amended sections, as attached hereto, be published in the advance sheets of the Pacific Reporter and thereafter in the Wyoming Reporter; that the amended sections shall become effective 60 days after the publication thereof in the advance sheets of the Pacific Reporter, and thereupon shall be spread at length upon the journal of this court.

REGULATIONS OF THE WYOMING STATE BOARD OF
CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION

Section IV. Standards for activity accreditation.

G. Identical activities will not be accredited unless they are held at least one year apart. Additionally, credit may not be allowed for welcoming or valedictory remarks exceeding one-quarter of an hour. Credit will be allowed for luncheon speeches shown to meet the foregoing standards.

Section XI. Failure to comply.

In the event an attorney fails to comply with the reporting or fee provisions of Rule 5 the Rules for Continuing Legal Education of Members of the Wyoming State Bar, or files a report showing on its face failure to complete the required number of accredited hours of continuing legal education, the Board shall obtain the consent of the State Board of Professional Responsibility pursuant to Rule 1 of the Disciplinary Code for the Wyoming State Bar to initiate action pursuant to these regulations. Then the Board shall notify said attorney in writing of such apparent noncompliance and said attorney shall have 15 days from the mailing of said notice to cure said failure to comply or make an appropriate application under Section VI. If the failure to comply is not cured or such application not approved, the Board shall report promptly to the court the failure of the attorney to comply with the Rules for Continuing Legal Education of Members of the Wyoming State Bar; such report may be with or without recommendation of the Board for appropriate action by the court.

Section XIII. Fees.

~~At the time of filing the report required by Rule 5, or if partial reports are filed, upon the filing of the first of such reports, the person filing such report shall pay a fee of \$5.00 to the Wyoming State Board of Continuing Legal Education, which fee shall be deposited in the Board's account and shall be utilized to pay for the costs of CLE administration.~~

Each active member of the bar shall pay an annual fee of \$5.00 to the Wyoming State Board of Continuing Legal Education, consistent with Rule 5 of the Rules for Continuing Legal Education of Members of the Wyoming State Bar. Such fee may be collected by the bar at the time of the collection of the annual license fee, but will constitute a fee to be used to defray the costs of administering the rules and regulations for continuing legal education and issuing annual reports. The date for payment of the fee shall be 30 days after the date of the annual notice sent by the bar.
