**ORDER ADOPTING THE REVISED UNIFORM BAIL AND FORFEITURE SCHEDULES AS APPENDIX I TO RULES 3.1(d)(1) and (g)(1), W.R.Cr.P., AS AMENDED HEREIN**

The court having deemed it necessary and proper to adopt the Revised Uniform Bail and Forfeiture Schedules, attached hereto as Appendix I to Rule 3.1, W.R.Cr.P., to be effective August 1, 1992; and to amend Rules 3.1(d)(1) and (g)(1), W.R.Cr.P.; it is therefore

**ORDERED** that Rules 3.1(d)(1) and (g)(1), W.R.Cr.P., shall be, and they are hereby, amended effective August 1, 1992, as follows:

Rule 3.1(d)(1).

(1) A person may satisfy a promise to appear in court by paying to the court, or to another authorized by that court to accept bond for misdemeanor offenses, on or before the appearance date the amount of the fine and COURT costs as listed on ~~a bond schedule~~ THE UNIFORM BAIL AND FORFEITURE SCHEDULES adopted and published by ~~competent authority~~ THE WYOMING SUPREME COURT AND SET FORTH IN APPENDIX I TO THIS RULE;

Rule 3.1(g)(1).

(1) Forfeit offenses are those misdemeanor offenses listed as forfeit offenses on ~~bond schedules~~ THE UNIFORM BAIL AND FORFEITURE SCHEDULES adopted and promulgated by ~~competent authority~~ THE WYOMING SUPREME COURT AND SET FORTH IN APPENDIX I TO THIS RULE. A citing officer may not check the box "MAY FORFEIT BOND IN LIEU OF APPEARANCE" on the citation for any offense other than a forfeit offense; and

It is further

**ORDERED** that Appendix I to Rule 3.1, W.R.Cr.P., attached hereto, shall be, and it is hereby, adopted as the Uniform Bail and Forfeiture Schedules to be used in all county courts and justice of the peace courts, effective August 1, 1992; and it is further

**ORDERED** that this order shall be published in the advance sheets of the Pacific Reporter and the Wyoming Reporter; and thereupon be spread at length upon the journal of this court.

**APPENDIX I  
APPENDIX TO RULE 3.1, W.R.Cr.P.  
UNIFORM BAIL AND FORFEITURE SCHEDULES**

For the sake of uniformity throughout the state, the following schedules have been established by the Wyoming Supreme Court and shall be used in all county courts and justice of the peace courts. (See attached Addendum I for order dated June 23, 1989, for \$5.00 reduced fine for seat belt usage.<sup>1</sup>)

Unless a specific bail amount appears in the body of this schedule, the amount of bail is:

A = \$ 35.00  
B = \$ 50.00  
C = \$100.00  
D = \$200.00  
E = \$400.00

**1. TRAFFIC OFFENSES**

1A. A person to whom a citation has issued must appear in court on the day and at the time specified in the citation unless the citing officer checks the box "MAY FORFEIT BOND IN LIEU OF APPEARANCE" on the citation.

If the "MAY FORFEIT BOND IN LIEU OF APPEARANCE" box is checked, the person cited must appear on the day and at the time specified on the citation or may post bond at or prior to the court date and forfeit the same in lieu of appearance.

Following are the misdemeanor offenses for which bond may be posted and forfeited:

<sup>1</sup> Seat belt reduction--W.S. 31-5-1402(e) provides that "All citations for violations of the motor vehicle laws of this state shall contain a notation by the issuing officer indicating whether the licensee complied with this section." (Viz, had seat belt fastened or was exempt from the requirement.) " Compliance with this section shall entitle a licensee to a five dollar (\$5.00) reduction in the fine otherwise imposed." The Wyoming Supreme Court ruled that it applies to both bail and fines.

**ORDER AMENDING UNIFORM BAIL SCHEDULE**

The court having determined it necessary and proper, in order to conform to W.S. 31-5-1402(e), to amend the Uniform Bail Schedule published by the court, which said schedule establishes the amount for appearance bonds and bail for violations of the motor vehicle laws of the State of Wyoming, it is therefore

ORDERED that the Uniform Bail Schedule, as revised on June 1, 1987, be, and it is hereby, amended to provide as follows:

1. That the amount of the appearance bond and bail presently set forth in the Uniform Bail Schedule, as revised by the Wyoming Supreme Court on June 1, 1987, for violations of the motor vehicle laws of the State of Wyoming shall be reduced in the amount of five dollars (\$5.00) whenever a citation for any violation of motor vehicle laws of the state is issued and the issuing officer indicates on the citation whether the licensee complied with W.S. 31-5-1402(e) (seat belt law).

FURTHER ORDERED that this amendment shall be effective this date and that copies of this order shall be transmitted to all Wyoming courts of limited jurisdiction and to all law enforcement agencies.
