**ORDER REPEALING RULE 905 OF
THE UNIFORM RULES FOR DISTRICT COURTS**

This matter came before the Court upon recommendation of the Board of Judicial Policy and Administration. During the 2014 Budget Session of the Wyoming Legislature, Wyoming Statute §§ 5-3-410 (a) through (d) was repealed. The repeal of that statute eliminated the forty-five dollar per day court reporter fee required in civil cases. Rule 905 of the Uniform Rules for District Courts assesses that same forty-five dollar per day fee in civil cases. In light of the repeal of Wyoming Statute §§ 5-3-410 (a) through (d), the Court has determined that Rule 905 of the Uniform Rules for District Courts should be repealed. It is, therefore,

ORDERED that Rule 905 of the Uniform Rules for District Courts of the State of Wyoming is hereby repealed as shown on the attachment hereto effective on July 1, 2014. It is further

ORDERED that this order and the attachment be published in the advance sheets of the Pacific Reporter; this rule repeal be documented in the Wyoming Court Rules Volume; and this order and the attachment be published online at the Wyoming Judicial Branch’s website, <http://www.courts.state.wy.us>. The rule repeal shall thereafter be spread at length upon the journal of this Court.

~~———— In all civil cases an appearance fee of \$45.00 shall be paid for each day, or any portion thereof, that evidence and testimony is received. This fee covers the reporting of all testimony or admissions made by either side, objections to the introduction of testimony, the ruling of the court thereon, and the exceptions taken thereto. The fee also covers the reporting of motions made within the trial proceeding, the hearing on objections to jury instructions and the reporting of the verdict. This fee does not cover special services such as voir dire, motion hearings outside of a trial proceeding, nor opening and closing statements.~~
