ORDER ADOPTING RULE 7.06
WYOMING RULES OF APPELLATE PROCEDURE

The court having deemed it advisable and necessary to adopt Rule 7.06, Wyoming Rules of Appellate Procedure, it is

ORDERED that the following Rule 7.06, Wyoming Rules of Appellate Procedure, be, and it is hereby, adopted to read as follows:


Rule 7.06. Abbreviated Opinions.

When all parties to an appeal stipulate in writing for a ruling by the Wyoming Supreme Court without published decision by entry of an abbreviated opinion, this court may, at its discretion with unanimous vote, determine the case by an abbreviated opinion. The decision for the case will provide the ultimate disposition without a detailed statement of facts or law. The opinion will not be published or generally disseminated and shall not constitute precedent of the Wyoming Supreme Court.

FURTHER ORDERED that the foregoing rule be published in the Advance Sheets of the Pacific Reporter and thereafter in the Wyoming Reporter; that said rule shall become effective sixty (60) days after publication in the Advance Sheets of the Pacific Reporter, and thereupon be spread at length on the journal of this court.
