**ORDER AMENDING RULE 4.01, WYOMING RULES OF APPELLATE
PROCEDURE**

The court having deemed it necessary and advisable to amend Rule 4.01, W.R.A.P., relating to the composition of the record on appeal; it is hereby

ORDERED that Rule 4.01, W.R.A.P., be, and it is hereby amended to read as follows:

Rule 4.01. Composition of record on appeal.

The original papers and exhibits filed in the district court, the transcript of proceedings, if any, or any designated portion thereof, and a certified copy of the docket entries prepared by the clerk of the district court shall constitute the record on appeal in all cases. The parties may agree by written stipulation filed in the district court that designated parts of the record need not be transmitted to the Supreme Court, in which event the parts shall be retained in the district court unless thereafter the Supreme Court shall order or any party shall request their transmission, but the parts thus designated shall nevertheless be a part of the record on appeal for all purposes.

Whenever such a designation is made, the papers transmitted to the Supreme Court shall always include the material


pleadings without unnecessary duplication, or the indictment or information and pleas and motions addressed thereto, the notice of appeal with date of filing, the stipulation making the designation, and any verdict, master's report, findings of fact or conclusions of law made a part of the record as provided in Rule 52(a), W.R.C.P., final order, judgment, sentence and statement of issues.

TRANSCRIPTS IN CRIMINAL CASES SHALL CONSIST OF ALL PROCEEDINGS HELD IN OPEN COURT INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO VOIR DIRE, OPENING STATEMENTS AND FINAL ARGUMENTS, CONFERENCES WITH THE PRESIDING JUDGE IN OPEN COURT AND IN THE COURT CHAMBERS, IN ADDITION TO THE TESTIMONY OF THE CASE AND OTHER REQUIRED MATERIALS.

FURTHER ORDERED that the foregoing Rule 4.01, W.R.A.P., be published in the Advance Sheets of the Pacific Reporter and thereafter in the Wyoming Reporter; that said rule become effective sixty (60) days after publication in the Advance Sheets of the Pacific Reporter; and thereupon be spread at length on the journal of this court.
